to you all

God's message is: Do not be afraid, I love you

"Do not be afraid" ... said the angel to Mary.
"Do not be afraid" ... said the angel to Joseph.
"Do not be afraid" ... said the angel to the shepherds.

Just about every time an angel appears in the pages of the Bible, one of the first things he says is: **"Do not be afraid"**.

Is this because the appearance of an angel is so startling that everyone quakes with fear at the sight? It could be, but on the other hand, perhaps the people who met an angel already had something they were frightened of in the first place. Maybe something in their own circumstances, maybe something going on around them, maybe they felt threatened or under pressure, or overwhelmed, and things looked bleak and gloomy.

Joseph was already afraid, because things had gone horribly wrong in his engagement. He was afraid for Mary, because she could be taken out and stoned to death; he was afraid for himself and what others may think of him; he was afraid for both their families and the disgrace and bad reputation they would have in the community. And so he had planned to set aside the engagement quietly, without going down the legal route; but even then it might not work; had the damage already been done? Mary was pregnant, and soon everyone would know. ... **'Do not be afraid'** ... said the angel to Joseph.

The shepherds, along with just about everybody else in Israel in the first century, lived in a constant state of fear. These were brutal times. People were being herded around from one place to another. The whole country, and much of the known world, was under Roman occupation, and they demanded that the people be counted back in their own home towns. Half the population was forced to be on the move. First century Israel was a fearful place to be, and a brutal place to be, with the Romans pushing people around, and before long Herod - the unpredictable local king trying to cling to what little power he had - ordering the slaughter of a whole generation of baby boys. Life was full of fears. ... **'Do not be afraid'** ... said the angel to the shepherds.

The angels may have been quelling the immediate fears, generated by their own sudden appearance; but they were also addressing other fears as they gave their good news of God at work and the good news of Immanuel - God right here with us; not remote and distant, not disinterested and uncaring, but coming right into our world in love ... for God so loved the world ...

What fears might we be carrying this Christmas and New Year time? There's certainly plenty of national fear and uncertainty, which we see flaring up in people getting angry with one another and then not listening to one another. And individually we can be carrying our own fears too ... it may be health concerns, or family worries; we may have a fear of things that might happen, and that other things might not happen; we may have fear of change, and fear that some things may never change ... the list could be endless and we could add one fear after another.

Let's be reassured this Christmastime that God is not remote and distant, he is indeed Immanuel - God with us. And already he is opening his future ahead of us, and inviting us to carry on journeying with him ... wherever that journey may take us in the year ahead. So let's hear the words of the angels to us:

Do not be afraid ... I'm here with good news for everyone, news that is joyful, and full of hope. The Christ, the Messiah, has come into the world. There is hope and there's a future. There's a way through to life that is full and complete, in the love of God and in the glory of God. Glory to God in the highest, and on earth: peace.





DITCHING THE CHALKBOARD FOR THE COMPUTER LAB

How you're helping Nepali students.



How did you learn to use a computer? You probably sat in front of one, right? Pupils at school in the UK learn the same way. They'll

probably have regular access to a laptop or personal device at home, too. It's easy. Accessible. Normal.

That's not how it is in Lamjung District in central Nepal. In Lamjung, only a small minority of students have access to a computer at home. Everyone else has to learn at school, which is difficult as schools don't have enough of them. Students learn instead by taking down instructions put on the classroom chalkboard or written in a textbook – instructions for how to start a computer and work through the very basics. They memorise the steps, and then eventually get to watch a teacher put them into action on an actual computer.

If there are other computers available for students to use, they often don't work properly, or can't be used because of national power cuts. And so it's back to learning from the textbook for these young people who need IT skills to get on in a world that is becoming increasingly reliant on technology.

BMS World Mission worker Simon Hall lives and works in Lamjung, training teachers in IT, and helping bring technology into the classroom. In the past few months, he's helped four schools through the process of securing and installing computers, and it's hoped more will follow.

Over 100 computers have been installed in schools in Lamjung over the last two years through Simon's work. The computers are new, publicly funded, and are in rooms that are battery-powered.

The students are understandably loving the opportunity to spend more time in front of a computer, as opposed to simply reading about them. Thank you for giving children in Lamjung the opportunity to learn the skills they need to succeed in the modern world.


Recipe for a Happy New Year

THE CHURCH PLANTERS WHO NEED YOUR PRAYER

"There were no Christians when we first came. None at all."

Being Jesus in a village that is 100 per cent Buddhist is challenging work. But church planters Helen and Wit Boondeekhun insist on living out their faith in Wang Daeng village.

It's really difficult for people to convert to Christianity in Wang Daeng, northern Thailand. BMS World Mission workers Helen and Wit have been faithfully serving the community and trying to meet the practical needs of their new neighbours for the last two years.

Creating strong relationships within the local community is especially important because many people there struggle with drug and alcohol addictions. "Recently, I found out one of the people I know, they're under 40, they just died because of alcohol," said Wit. Watching their friends struggle is

immensely challenging for the Boondeekhuns, but they are committed to finding ways to keep the community thriving and bring people to Christ.

When they first arrived, they set up English classes. At first with just a handful of students, but now they have about 40 local students enrolled. But their first believer came through other means.

"Through the basket weaving project, we got to know this lady, and she became a Christian," said Helen. "But nobody really knows about this. She hasn't been brave or bold enough to tell her friends yet, because it's hard."


Even though it is a challenge, the Boondeekhuns are consistently living out their faith and sharing it with their
